



Ski Trip –Sugar Bowl Jan.28-30, 2011

This trip is one of the most popular adventures for Troop 57 Scouts. One of the best skiing in the Sierras. 4 peaks, 13 chairs and the most annual snowfall in the Sierras. The resort caters to all levels of skiers and snow boarders. This is a must do outing. See YOU in the powder! Limited to 24 scouts, so sign up early!

- Date:** 1/28/11-1/30/11 (Friday afternoon, Saturday, Sunday)
 Leave: Friday 1/28/2010 2:30 PM from the Scout House. Return: Sunday 1/30/10 early evening
- Lodge:** We stay as a group at Clair Tappan Lodge
- Ski Resort:** Sugar Bowl resort.
- Who:** We have a reservation for up to 32 people (8 adults and 24 scouts). This is not a camping trip at all, and is appropriate for all scouts.

- Activities:** One and one-half days of downhill skiing or snowboarding at Sugar Bowl. Ski merit badge opportunity!
- Food:** Breakfast Saturday, through lunch Sunday, including sack lunches for slopes will be provided by the lodge. Sierra Club maintains low prices due to cooperative style and help out with meal by guest. Bring money for fast food dinner on the drive up and possibly dinner on the drive back.
- Cost:** Total: \$248 (13 and up), \$282 (adult), \$176 (<13)
 Lodging (2 nights): scouts \$110, adults \$120; 2 day lift ticket:\$118 (13 and up), \$142 (adult), \$46 (<13 years old) Gas:\$20 (Price calculation tentative and subject to change).
 Note that this does not include equipment. Ski/Snowboard equipment is generally around \$28 per day (\$15 per day 12 and under).
- Required:** Everyone needs to provide his own pillow, toiletries, towel, sleeping bag, ski clothes, helmets and ski equipment.
 Troop 57 neckerchief! We shall wear them on the slopes for easy identification (tie around arm)!
 Ski helmet. Required by the Boys Scouts of America on ski outings.
 Annual Health and Medical Form must be current.
 Carry your own skis and helmets. Rent in Palo Alto. We recommend Ski Renter of Mountain View.
